A few month's back we discussed how sometimes bidding as an opponent can help declarer in the play by adopting lines that normally wouldn't be best percentage.

I overcalled 1N with my hand and my partner transferred to spades and East bid again. I ac-



cepted the transfer and my partner put me in game.

The opening lead was the 5D and I could see that virtually all the high cards were in the East hand so I said to myself, "Do you feel lucky punk?" a famous quote from Dirty Harry.

I won the A of diamonds and thought I was going to lose a high spade and a diamond and maybe even a club trick so I started to draw trumps by playing the A and that dropped the K and I led 3 more rounds of trump while East discarded 2 diamonds and a heart. I discarded my J hearts.

I next cashed the A and K clubs dropping the Q and played 3 more clubs, East discarded 2 more diamonds and 1 heart while I discarded the 9 diamonds and trumped a diamond in the dummy setting up my last diamond making 7. I took 5S, 1H, 2D and 5 clubs for 100% out of a field of 240 tables. I think East didn't see my J hearts because he could have held onto a high diamond.

Most players did not bid with that garbage that East had so a lot of the declarers took the spade finesse losing to the K and had a diamond been led initially they would have lost an early diamond to the K making 5.

Rusty Bridge Part III Tuesdays, October 21 December 9 1pm—3pm
Part III covers what we could not finish in Part II, most likely Preemptive bidding, what is and is not a Forcing bid, and bidding in the "balancing" seat. Other confusing subjects like reverse bids, the law of total tricks, etc. may be covered time permitting. There will be lots of practice hands (8+) with each class.

The Heart Series/Defense- Tuesdays, October 21--December 9 10am - noon

Part I encompasses Leads against NT, Leads against Suit contracts, Second-Hand play, and Third-Hand play. The course book is available online. There will be lots of hands with which to practice.

Rusty Bridge Part I Wednesdays, November 5 Dec 17 1pm-3 pm

This 7-week course is for those who want to update their bridge game while completely reviewing solid basic bidding. There will be 8 hands to practice with each class. One must have some basic understanding of bridge bidding for this class. This is not for beginners. A booklet is available from the instructor for \$15 which covers Rusty Bridge I, II, and III

Rusty Bridge Part II Thursdays, October 16 - November 6 10am - noon

Part II covers Stayman, Blackwood, and Gerber conventions, "Two Club" openings and responses, Weak Two openings, Preemptive bidding, Forcing bids, and bidding in the "balancing" seat. Each session will consist of a half-hour lecture and 1-1/2 hours of supervised play with pre-dealt hands that illustrate the day's subject. A workbook covering both Part I and Part II is available from the instructor for \$15.

It is a popular variation of the Standard American bidding system. This system helps the players get to the best game contracts or explore Slam possibilities at a lower level. We also introduce the response of 1NT as a forcing bid to improve potential part score contracts. Each class will have practice hands to help experience this modification. The textbook I use is Audrey Grant's 2 over 1 Game Force which can be bought on the internet.


