

NAP FINALIST

NAP - North American Pairs, is an event that is played every year at the Spring Nationals.

Pairs must qualify by placing in the top three or four in their district (depending on the flight).

During the summer months, clubs can hold up to two qualifying games each month. Those who place in the top half of the field are then qualified to the Unit level.

In previous years, there have been Unit NAP games, sending a certain number to the District game, but since COVID, this step has been bypassed, and all club qualifiers are eligible to play in the District NAP Qualifying Game, usually held in late fall/January.

Based on the names I saw. I was the only Unit 499 qualifier. FYI, my partner is from the Sacramento area.

You are now going to see why I called this "Do you feel lucky punk" part 2.

This result was determined by an opening lead that just didn't work out.



Look at the West hand and decide what you would have led after hearing the auction. Most of the time when the bidding goes this way you try to lead a major suit and my thinking is that you should lead the one where with a little help from your partner you can take some tricks. My opponent led the 3 spades and from that holding it will take until next month to get even 1 trick in that suit.

Look what it did for me. I won the spade in my hand and led the 8 clubs and when that held, I led another club, winning in dummy and now I took the diamond finesse and then ran 4 more clubs, cashed the A spades and took another diamond finesse, making 7: 3 spades, 1 heart, 3 diamonds and 6 clubs.

I am not sure how I would have played this had a heart been led. I might have ducked one or 2 rounds then making only 5. With the spade lead, I could finesse as much as I wanted and when they both worked you can see why I called it "Do you feel lucky punk" part 2 for 92%


