# What makes duplicate bridge so fascinating?

Duplicate bridge is recognized for its complexity and intellectual appeal. Notably, prominent figures such as Bill Gates, Warren Buffett, and Mark Zuckerberg employ professional players to play with them for national tournaments, highlighting the game's value among the very rich and influential individuals. As Bill Gates observes, "Bridge provides the kind of mental acuity that is handy for anything you want to do with excellence."

At the highest level, bridge necessitates strategic thinking and sound decision-making, skills esteemed in both business and technology sectors. Its intricate nature offers vast opportunities for intellectual development and competitive engagement, making it particularly attractive to those who appreciate rigorous mental challenges. While bridge is often regarded as a pursuit of perfection, it is equally a discipline where minimizing mistakes is paramount.

Bridge encompasses elements of logic, analysis, sport, counting, partnership, and community. It extends far beyond mere competition; in duplicate bridge, emphasis is placed on continuous learning and self-improvement rather than solely on outcomes—a distinction from party or money bridge games. Logical reasoning and quantitative assessment underpin both bidding and play.

The game cultivates character by reinforcing the importance of ongoing education and communication. Just when you think you have discussed everything with your partner something new comes up so it is very humbling. Success varies, underscoring the dynamic nature of performance and understanding. The challenge lies in refining communication between partners and their execution at each hand and at each session.

Moreover, bridge offers sustained mental stimulation, demanding constant cognitive engagement throughout play. Participation at the national level is mentally demanding, often resulting in significant fatigue. The development of effective partnerships is essential for achieving success in this intellectually rigorous environment. I have previously written an article about the importance of partnerships, and I have named that document appropriately "Your partner is a gift".

As you all know, sometimes you cannot get to the best matchpoint contract. Take this hand for example. I was North and opened 1D, my partner responded 2C and West bid 2H. I could have said 2N but I didn't think I was good enough to do that so I bid 2S hoping my partner had the right hand to ask for a heart stopper. East now bid 3H and my partner couldn't say 3N so he said 4C and I bid 5C. 5C looks like a good contract but it's not going to score well because 3N makes at least 4.

The opening lead was the Q spades and now it looks like 5C is going down. This lead smells like a singleton. Don't you just hate it when your opponents lead their singletons against your suit contract? Further thought here is that for once you hope it is a singleton and that West has both aces, watch what happens.

You win the A spades and draw 3 rounds of trump and then lead the K hearts. West will have to win it and since West has the A diamonds, that is their last trick, you get 1 spade, 2 hearts, 1 diamond and 7 clubs scoring 11 tricks.

Notice that it is difficult to set 3H more than your game.

I did check out some other results and at one of them, same contract and lead, the declarer gave up a spade and lost 3 tricks, minus 50 for 3%. Plus 400 was 25% and plus 430 was 60%.

Some days the opponents earn their good boards!!

Overtricks by the Bay meets on Tuesdays at 9am at the Brentwood Senior Center.


